Fishing

At the Fränkische Saale

Boat tours

A diverse trip through unspoiled nature, past castles, palaces and mills, on the Fränkische Saale is a good choice.

Flying

Gliders, motorised aeroplanes and model planes can fly from the special airfield "Hohe Lanz"; hang-gliding and paragliding are available "An der Kanzel".

Nordic Walking

10 routes through fields, meadows and vineyards with wonderful panorama views.

Bicycle tours

Cycling offers in diverse landscapes, well-developed network of bicycle routes.

Swimmina

Saaletalbad: indoor pool, sauna, outdoor pool (heated) with 10 m diving platform, at the sports centre. The outdoor pool also has a "beach volleyball facility" with finest quartz sand.

2-course city menu

Two round tours (Southern and Northern old town) invite to an enjoyable and pleasant tour to discover the past and present. Information panels tell facts, stories and experiences of extraordinary people.

Hiking

Beautiful round tours, e.g. in the quarters of Diebach, Morlesau and Untererthal, Abtsweg from Fulda to Hammelburg, Karolinger Weg, regular guided hikes.

Educational wine trail

Start: Old town monastery Entertaining hike with information panels on the history of wine through vineyards around Saaleck Castle. 5.8 km

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

City hall with market fountain

The predecessor building of the current city hall was built from 1524 to 1529, according to the plans of architect Johannes Schoner. A fire destroyed the building to its foundations in 1854.

It was rebuilt in neo-Gothic Style in the subsequent

The market fountain from 1541, one of the best examples of early Franconian Renaissance, was also planned by Johannes Schoner.

2 Kellereischloss "Wine Cellar Castle"

Built from 1726 to 1731 under Prince Abbot Adolph von Dalberg, after plans made by court architect Andreas Gallasini from Mantua. The Kellereischloss, colloquially also called the "Red Palace", served as the summer residence for the Prince Abbots of Fulda, while its large cellars were used to store wine. Today, the building houses -among others -the vintners' society of Franconia, the tourist information and the town library of Hammelbura.

B Catholic town parish church

St. Johannes Baptista (1389-1461). Choir by master builder Conrad Smyde 1389, expanded in 1957/58. This was followed in 1992/93 by comprehensive interior renovation, redesign of the sanctuary and the figure program, as well as a new organ construction as the great finale. A haloed Madonna is placed above the high altar.

The work is ascribed to Würzburg court sculptor Jakob Auvera.

4 Evangelical parish church St. Michael
A modern church by Olaf Andreas Gulbransson, dating from 1962. The Altar,
pulpit and baptismal font are from
sculptor Karl Hofmann, Munich.

The altar wall "The heavenly Jerusalem" is from Prof. G. Bromberger, Academy of Arts, Munich.

Around 1250, the Prince Abbots of Fulda fortified Hammelburg as protection against hostile attacks by building walls, trenches, 3 towers with gates and 11 towers in the wall. Three buildings from this Medieval town fortification are preserved: the Mönchsturm, the Hüterturm and the Baderturm.

8 Museum Herrenmühle

The Herrenmühle is a beautiful, baroque building dating from around 1700. The mill has housed a museum with a permanent exhibition on the subject of "bread and wine" since 1991, which has been redesigned in 2017.

Old town monastery and Bavarian academy of music

The church and convent of the Franciscan old town monastery was built by Prince

Abbot Joachim von Gravenegg in 1656/58. A new building was built after a fire in 1698, which continues to be one of the most beautiful examples of Fulda's baroque era. The Way of the Cross "Kapellenkreuzweg" that leads around the monastery was set up in 1733. It is worth seeing and well known beyond the region. In 1980, the buildings of the Bavarian academy of music were built where the brewery "Felsenkeller" used to be.

10 Saaleck Castle

Formerly an administrative castle with its oldest parts dating from the 12th century. From the keep, which was used as a prison tower until 1749, it is possible to look across the Saale valley all the way into the Rhön area on a clear day. Today, Saaleck Castle houses a hotel with restaurant and the "Weingut-Lange-Schloss Saaleck".

Southern town wall ("Garden of arts")
Gardens have been set up between the rebuilt parts of the southern town wall. They invite to rest and relax, but also offer a special art treat: Works by Luk Van Soom, an artist from the Belgian partner town Turnhout, have found a place here. Among them is the bronze sculpture "Romeo and Juliet".

ID Hospital church St. Nikolaus

The citizens' hospital was built under Abbot Heinrich von Hohenberg (1315-1353) and had a chapel added to it in 1404 already. After the fire of 1854, the façade was improved with a turret in a Neogothic style. The choir room was redesigned by Georg Ruppert in 1972, while the choir windows were designed by Hammelburg artist Robert Höfling.
